A certain church had a beautiful stained-glass window just behind the pulpit. It depicted Jesus Christ on the cross. One Sunday there was a guest minister who was much smaller than the regular pastor. A little girl listened to the guest for a time, then turned to her mother and asked, "Where is the man who usually stands there so we can't see Jesus?"

Too many preachers of the Word so magnify themselves and their gifts that they fail to reveal the glory of Jesus Christ. Paul gloried in the cross of Christ (Gal. 6:14) and made it the center of his message.

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Knowing Nothing

Christ and Him Crucified

1 Corinthians 15:3-5

³For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, ⁵and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve.

Weakness, Fear and Trembling

"1 Now I, Paul, myself am pleading with you by the meekness and gentleness of Christ who in presence am lowly among you, but being absent am bold toward you.² But I beg you that when I am present I may not be bold with that confidence by which I intend to be bold against some, who think of us as if we walked according to the flesh.³ For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh.⁴ For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, ⁵ casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ, ⁶ and being ready to punish all disobedience when your obedience is fulfilled. ⁷ Do you look at things according to the outward appearance? If anyone is convinced in himself that he is Christ's, let him again consider this in himself, that just as he is Christ's, even so we are Christ's.⁸ For even if I should boast somewhat more about our authority, which the Lord gave us for edification and not for your destruction, I shall not be ashamed—⁹lest I seem to terrify you by letters. ¹⁰ "For his letters," they say, "are weighty and powerful, but his bodily presence is weak, and his speech contemptible."¹¹ Let such a person consider this, that what we are in word by letters when we are absent, such we will also be in deed when we are present. ¹² For we dare not class ourselves or compare ourselves with those who commend themselves. But they, measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise." (2 Corinthians 10:1-12 NKIV)


Demonstration of the Spirit and Power

- Does this mean Paul did miracles in Corinth?
- NO! Were this to be a reference to miracles it would contradict what Paul had already said:
- "²²For Jews request a sign, and Greeks seek after wisdom;
 ²³but we preach Christ crucified, to the Jews a stumbling block and to the Greeks foolishness,"
 (1 Corinthians 1:22–23 NKJV)
- What was this demonstration?


Demonstration

- The Greek word translated "demonstration" is a word for powerful evidence or proof
- When a person trusts in Jesus Christ there are many changes that occur.
- Death to Life, Spiritually Blind and Deaf to Hearing and Seeing, Enslaved to Sin to Empowered by the Spirit





"But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name," (John 1:12 NAS20)

"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NAS20)

""Truly, truly, I say to you, the one who hears My word, and believes Him who sent Me, has eternal life, and does not come into judgment, but has passed out of death into life." (John 5:24 NAS20)

"²¹ But now apart from the Law the righteousness of God has been revealed, being witnessed by the Law and the Prophets, ²² but it is the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all those who believe; for there is no distinction, ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God displayed publicly as a propitiation in His blood through faith. This was to demonstrate His righteousness, because in God's merciful restraint He let the sins previously committed go unpunished; ²⁶ for the demonstration, that is, of His righteousness at the present time, so that He would be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus." (Romans 3:21–26 NAS20)

"
[®]For by grace you have been saved through faith; and this is not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; [®] not a result of works, so that no one may boast." (Ephesians 2:8–9 NAS20)

So, we can sin all we want?

"What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase?²Far from it! How shall we who died to sin still live in it?³Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death? Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too may walk in newness of life. For if we have become united with Him in the likeness of His death, certainly we shall also be in the likeness of His resurrection, knowing this, that our old self was crucified with Him, in order that our body of sin might be done away with, so that we would no longer be slaves to sin; for the one who has died is freed from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, is never to die again; death no longer is master over Him. 10 For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all time; but the life that He lives, He lives to God. So you too, consider yourselves to be dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus."



Proof of Life (v. 5)

- The Difference between Eternal Security and Assurance of Salvation

The gospel is still God's power to change men's lives (Rom. 1:16). Effectiveness in evangelism does not depend on our arguments or persuasive gimmicks but on the power of the Spirit of God at work in our lives and through the Word that we share.

The Scottish minister John Hutton used to tell a story with enthusiasm. A man who had been a degenerate and a drunkard was captured by Christ. 



Who is Spiritual?

• A person can rightly be called a Christian who has a right relationship to Christ by grace through faith. A person can rightly be called Spiritual who has a right relationship to the Holy Spirit by walking in the Spirit.

- Doubts their salvation
- Easily shaken
- Legalism-license cycles.

Realistic Expectations

- First visited Corinth in 50 ad
- He wrote this letter around 55 ad
- By this time, he expected them to be mature in their faith
- Yet, their sectarianism was evidence of one of two things
- They were not yet mature
- Or they were carnal (not living according to their faith)

Milk for Babies – Solids for Adults



Hebrews 5:12–14 NKJV

"For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the first principles of the oracles of God; and you have come to need milk and not solid food. For everyone who partakes only of milk is unskilled in the word of righteousness, for he is a babe. But solid food belongs to those who are of full age, that is, those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil."

14 Rewards Promised in the Bible

Adapted from Dr. David Kyle Foster

1. For <u>faith</u> in the LORD

Reward: God Himself (Genesis 15:1)

2. For keeping God's statutes Reward: a great reward (<u>Psalm 19:21</u>)

3. For conducting ourselves well **Reward:** an unnamed reward (<u>Psalm 62:12</u>; <u>Jeremiah</u> <u>17:32</u>; <u>Matthew 16:27</u>; <u>Revelation 22:12</u>)

4. For sowing righteousness Reward: a sure reward (Proverbs 11:18)

5. For being kind to the poor **Reward:** an unnamed reward (<u>Proverbs 19:17</u>; <u>Proverbs</u> <u>25:22</u>)

6. For being persecuted because of Him
Reward: a great reward (Matthew 5:12; Matthew
6:1, Matthew 6:5)

7. For welcoming true prophets or righteous men **Reward:** an unnamed reward (<u>Matthew 10:41</u>)

8. For doing acts of righteousness for the praise of God rather than men Reward: an unnamed reward (<u>Matthew 6:1</u>)

9. For loving your enemies, lending to and doing good to them without expectation Reward: a great reward (<u>Luke 6:35</u>)

10. For actions found to be of good quality in God's sight **Reward:** an unnamed reward (<u>1 Corinthians 3:8</u>, <u>1</u> Corinthians 12-15)

11. For doing good wholeheartedly **Reward:** an unnamed reward (<u>Colossians 3:23</u>)

12. For standing your ground during persecution and suffering with confident perseverance **Reward:** an unnamed reward (<u>Hebrews 10:32-39</u>)

13. For choosing to suffer mistreatment for God's sake **Reward:** an unnamed reward (<u>Hebrews 11:6</u>)

14. For faithfully continuing in the teaching of Christ **Reward:** rewarded fully (<u>2 John 8-9</u>)

13 Crowns Promised in the Bible

Adapted from Dr. David Kyle Foster

1. For those who delight the Lord by being humble **Crown**: a crown of <u>salvation</u> (<u>Psalm 149:4</u>)

2. For those who esteem wisdom Crown: a crown of splendor (Proverbs 4:9)

3. For those who lead a righteous life **Crown:** a crown of blessing (<u>Proverbs 10:6</u>)

4. For the ransomed of the Lord who walk in the way of holiness **Crown:** a crown of everlasting joy...and gladness (<u>Isaiah</u> <u>35:10</u> and <u>Isaiah 51:11</u>)

5. For the poor, brokenhearted, captives/prisoners, mourners who are oaks of righteousness **Crown:** a crown of beauty (<u>Isaiah 61:3</u>)

6. For those who compete (for the sake of the gospel) in the game (of serving the Lord) after strict training

Crown: a crown that will last forever (1 Corinthians 9:25)

7. For those who act like a "brother" to other believers **Crown:** a crown of joy (<u>Philippians 4:1</u>; <u>1 Thessalonians</u> <u>2:19</u>)

8. For those who have "fought the good fight, finished the race and kept the faith," as well as for "all who have longed for His appearing"

Crown: a crown of righteousness (2 Timothy 4:8)

9. For those who have persevered under trial and stood the test

Crown: the crown of life (James 1:12)

10. For those who have remained faithful unto death during trials and persecutions **Crown:** the crown of life (<u>Revelation 2:10</u>)

11. For those church elders who have been faithful as godly examples over their flock **Crown:** an unfading crown of glory (<u>1 Peter 5:4</u>)

12. For elders (the heads of the 12 tribes of Israel and the 12 Apostles) who are seated before the throne of God **Crown:** crowns of gold (<u>Revelation 4:4</u>)


13. For running the race Crown: a victor's crown (<u>2 Timothy 2:5</u>)


